

ASSESSMENT & PLACEMENT CHART FOR HIGH SCHOOL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Guidelines

High school concurrent students are not eligible for remediation enrollments or alternate remedial measurements used to evaluate incoming freshmen. High school concurrent students may only enroll into college-level courses (1000 and 2000 level courses) and into courses in which the appropriate subject test score and course prerequisites are met.

Admissions

High school juniors or seniors must first meet or exceed any one requirement for *successful admissions* as below. Homeschool or unaccredited high schools will be considered junior or senior when they have completed enough high school coursework to be equivalent to an individual who is classified as a junior or senior at an accredited high school; admissions eligibility based on 19 ACT Composite or higher.

Enrollment

19 ACT Subject test score Students must have a 19 ACT in the subject area in which they wish to enroll. For subjects other than English, math, or science, student must have a 19 ACT Reading score. For SAT testing, students must have a 510 Evidence based Reading & Writing to take any subject other than math or science, or a 510 Math to take college math.

Appropriate Math MATH-1513 is a PRE-CALCULUS course appropriate for STEM majors and business majors. Students pursuing Sociology or Psychology majors should enroll into MATH-2123 Elementary Statistics. Student pursuing all other degrees should enroll into MATH-1413 Survey of Contemporary Math or verify math requirement at college of choice.

19 semester credit hours limit A high school student may enroll in a combined number of high school and college courses per semester not to exceed a full-time college workload of 19 semester credit hours. For purposes of calculating workload, one-half high school unit is equivalent to three semester credit hours of college work.

Enrollment with Secondary Testing Measurements

For concurrent students to enroll in a college-level course, they must earn the minimum ACT subject score (as below) in that particular subject area to show college readiness. A high school student who doesn't earn the minimum ACT subject score will not be allowed to enroll in those college subject areas. However, students may subsequently test with CASC's on-campus NG-Accuplacer as secondary testing to determine course enrollment eligibility. Student scoring at or above cut-off score in a subject area may enroll into course in that subject area.

Assessment and Course Placement Chart

Students who enroll into college courses under concurrent enrollment must meet the ACT, SAT, or NG-Accuplacer testing requirements as defined below. Deficiency enrollment is not permitted for concurrent enrollment.
